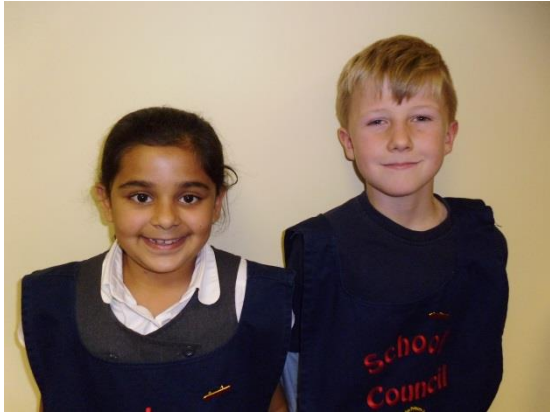
School Council

Pupils are at the heart of the Oughtibridge Primary School and so are involved in some of the decisions made to improve teaching and learning. The School Council gives the children in Key Stage 2 a voice to express the views of their classmates.

At the beginning of each year, two representatives are elected from each class. They present their ideas to their peers who secretly vote and the two with the most votes represent the class. The children take the role very seriously and relish the responsibility which comes with the 'job'.

They are identified by a tabard which they wear when on official business such as showing visitors around school, helping out at school discos and fund raising events. The children on the School Council meet with the Deputy Headteacher at least once every half term. The designated Chairperson leads the meeting following an agreed agenda and minutes are taken by the appointed secretary. They also meet with members of other schools, sharing ideas and working together on projects. They are encouraged to understand and value the ideals of democracy and citizenship through holding meetings at the local parish council chambers and visiting the Town Hall to meet the Lord Mayor.

Through the suggestions of the School Council we have an outdoor classroom and a KS2 shelter. Lunchtimes have been improved through the introduction of tablecloths, aprons for the servers at each table and background music while the children eat. The School Council have also raised money for picnic blankets so there was somewhere for children to sit in the shade on hot sunny days.
