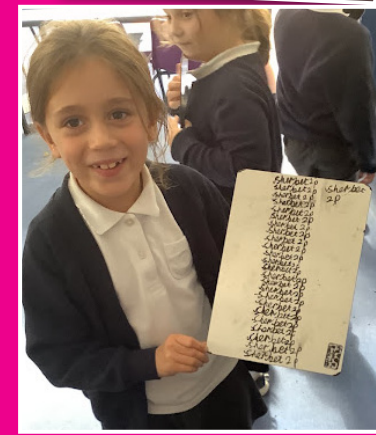
FS2 Dentist Visit
