Reward 'average' kids	All children will receive at least one certificate in our Friday celebration assembly per year. Staff keep a track of dojos and make sure that all children receive them. Our emphasis is always on rewarding effort not ability
Termly updates of what is being covered in school	Curriculum Bulletins are sent home every term. Parent/Carers have the opportunity to look at children's books 3 times a year. Curriculum overviews are available on the website which provide more detail
Mathematics curriculum - the importance of mastery maths and how this should be as important as phonics learning	Mastering Number, 15 minute daily programme, which teaches pupils number facts fluency, was introduced in KS1 in 2024-25. This is now being implemented in Y3, Y4 and Y5. Parent workshops will be held in the Spring term
